<u>Non-residential</u>	Properties on Bureau of Reclamation (BOR) land will be cleaned up by Federal agencies. Owners of all other non-residential properties must file for a DAR with the County.	Properties on BOR land will be cleaned up by Federal agencies. Owners of all other non-residential properties must file for a DAR with the County or submit a letter requesting inclusion in public program due to hardship. DAR Submittal Instructions

- Review DAR document and gather required information including name of Asbestos Consultant (structures older than 1990) and Hazardous Waste Contractor
- Responsible for Phase I (hazardous waste/asbestos removal) and Phase II, structural debris and ash removal
- When ready, schedule an appt.-there is a link in the instruction document or call (707)299-1350 for assistance



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DAR Submittal Instructions

- Phone appointments preferred due to social distancing
- During appointment PBES staff will review DAR plan for completeness
- Submittal may be in person or by email (instructions are being updated to reflect electronic submittal)
- Authorized Agent form required if 3rd party is submitting
- Trust/LLC papers as applicable needed for signature authority



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DAR Completion

- Remove all debris, ash and foundations (unless certified to keep)
- Conduct required soil sampling
- Install required erosion control
- Call for final inspection
- Fill out Self Certification of Completion Form and submit along with all disposal receipts and required letters (from asbestos consultant, PG/PE, Civil/Structural Engineer)



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Return of Property to Owner

- County will provide letter to owner certifying all debris and ash removal to be complete and property is ready for rebuild
- Proceed to next steps on roadmap!



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
